ASSOCIATE COMMISSIONER FOR TEACHER AND EDUCATIONAL LEADERSHIP INITIATIVES

The Associate Commissioner reports directly to the Deputy Commissioner for Planning, Research & Academic Affairs within the Board of Regents (BoR) and is a full time, 12 months position.

Responsibilities include:

- Advising the BoR Deputy Commissioner for Planning, Research & Academic Affairs on issues pertaining to teacher preparation, educational leadership preparation, and PK-12 education;
- Serving as the Director of the BoR Center for Innovative Teaching and Learning (CITAL) whose purpose is to help improve university-based teacher and educational leader preparation programs;
- Serving as the State Consultant and BoR contact person for the Council for the Accreditation of Educator Preparation (CAEP);
- Representing the BoR and higher education at teacher education and educational leadership related state-level
 meetings with universities, university systems, Board of Elementary and Secondary Education (BESE),
 Louisiana Department of Education (LDOE), and other state agencies;
- In consultation with the Associate Commissioner for Academic Affairs, reviewing requests from universities and two-year colleges for new degrees/programs, and changes in existing degrees/programs to ensure that they meet BESE certification requirements and BoR requirements;
- Applying higher education knowledge when meeting with BoR, BESE, LDOE, and other state agency staff to
 discuss policy changes and implementation of strategies that impact teacher preparation and educational
 leadership preparation;
- Monitoring the preparation and submission of teacher preparation data for the State, ETS, Title II, and Westat by universities to ensure data accuracy;
- Developing and implementing data bases to support State and national reports about teacher preparation and educational leadership preparation;
- Responding to questions from legislative staff regarding policy changes to teacher and educational leadership preparation programs and fiscal impact;
- Applying knowledge of CAEP national program accreditation and State policy changes to support universities and two-year colleges as they address changing national and state expectations;
- Designing, developing and managing grants that impact PK-16+ education; and
- Serving as a champion of teacher preparation and educational leadership preparation in Louisiana.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Minimum of an earned master's degree in an education related field from a regionally accredited institution; doctorate preferred.
- Minimum of three years of professional experience within a higher education setting in an education related field.
- Demonstrated research related capabilities.
- Excellent technological skills.
- Exemplary communication skills, both oral and written.

Preferred Qualification:

• Current knowledge about CAEP national program accreditation.
