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## **Agenda Item III.A.1.a.**

### **DeVry University Naperville, Illinois**

#### BACKGROUND

DeVry University (DeVry) is not incorporated in the state of Louisiana. The institution, originally opened in 1931 in Chicago, Illinois, is a private university owned by DeVry Inc. (traded on the New York Stock Exchange since 1995), and is seeking its initial license. DeVry is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

#### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

DeVry offers a wide variety of undergraduate and selected graduate programs. The institution is seeking licensure to offer its accredited Associate of Applied Science in Health Information Technology (HIT) and its Bachelor of Science in Health Information Management (HIM) online to Louisiana residents. Typically the online nature of the delivery system would not require licensure. However, since both programs require clinical experiences, licensure is necessary.

#### FACULTY

DeVry employs 89 faculty to support its online programs, nineteen trained at the doctorate level and 70 at the master's level.

#### FACILITIES

Since DeVry operates programs online with administrative and academic support in Naperville, there are no out-of-state physical facilities. Associate and bachelors students will complete clinical experiences at various locations in Louisiana.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the institution's and academic program's accreditation, and the general oversight by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents issue an initial operating license to DeVry University, located in Naperville, Illinois.

## **Agenda Item III.A.1.b.**

### **Maryville University St. Louis, Missouri**

#### BACKGROUND

Maryville University (Maryville) is not incorporated in the state of Louisiana. The institution, founded in 1872, is a private primarily undergraduate university in the state of Missouri and is seeking its initial license. Maryville is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

#### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Maryville offers a wide variety of undergraduate and selected graduate programs. The institution is seeking licensure to offer its CCNE-accredited online master's degree programs in nursing to Louisiana residents. Typically the online nature of the delivery system would not require licensure. However, since its Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) programs require clinical experiences, licensure is necessary.

#### FACULTY

Maryville employs two faculty to support the clinical component of its MSN online programs, one part-time faculty holding the doctorate and one full-time faculty trained at the master's level.

#### FACILITIES

Since Maryville operates programs online with administrative and academic support in St. Louis, there are no out-of-state physical facilities. MSN students will complete clinical experiences at various locations in Louisiana.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the institution's and academic program's accreditation, and the general oversight by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents issue an initial operating license to Maryville University, located in St. Louis, Missouri.

## **Agenda Item III.A.2.a.**

### **Chamberlain College of Nursing Addison, Illinois**

#### BACKGROUND

Chamberlain College of Nursing (Chamberlain) is not incorporated in the state of Louisiana. The institution is a subsidiary of DeVry Inc. in the state of Illinois and was first licensed in 2011. The institution was formerly the Deaconess College of Nursing and changed its name to the current institution when purchased by DeVry in 2006. Chamberlain is headquartered in Addison, Illinois, has operations in nine states and is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools.

#### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Chamberlain offers its Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education accredited online Master of Science in Nursing degree (with five tracks) and its Doctor of Nursing Practice program (with two tracks) to Louisiana residents. Typically, the online nature of the delivery system would not require licensure. However, since the programs require clinical experiences, licensure is necessary.

#### FACULTY

Chamberlain employs sixty-six faculty to support its online graduate nursing programs available to Louisiana residents, all trained at the doctoral level. Of the sixty-six faculty, twelve are employed full-time.

#### FACILITIES

Since much of the proposed program will be offered online, there will be no need for physical facilities. Clinical experiences will be held in a variety of healthcare settings.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the college's campus and program accreditation, and the general oversight by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve license renewal for Chamberlain College of Nursing, headquartered in Addison, Illinois.

## **Agenda Item III.A.2.b.**

### **Grand Canyon University Phoenix, AZ 85017**

#### BACKGROUND

Grand Canyon University is not incorporated in the state of Louisiana. Founded in 1949, the university was first licensed by the Board of Regents in 2007. Grand Canyon University is headquartered in Phoenix, Arizona and is accredited by the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools (NCA).

#### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Grand Canyon University recruits in the state of Louisiana for many of its distance learning programs. The institution offers 27 bachelors, 29 masters and four doctorate degree programs to Louisiana residents. In fall, 2010, the institution reports thirty-two Louisiana residents enrolled at the doctoral level, 255 in masters programs, and 377 in bachelors programs.

#### FACULTY

The institution employs 1,785 faculty, 168 on a full-time basis. Five-hundred ninety of the faculty hold the doctorate.

#### FACILITIES

Grand Canyon University offers distance education programs exclusively. The institution occasionally rents or uses facilities in Louisiana to hold information/orientation sessions for interested residents.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the university's recognized campus and program accreditation, and the general oversight of the program by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve license renewal for Grand Canyon University, located in Phoenix, Arizona.

### **Agenda Item III.A.2.c.**

#### **Panola College Carthage, Texas 75633**

##### BACKGROUND

Panola College is not incorporated in Louisiana. The college was first licensed with the Board of Regents in 2001. The institution is a publicly-supported college headquartered in Panola, Texas and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

##### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Panola College currently offers an NLN accredited associate degree in nursing and a licensed vocational nursing program through the institution's Carthage, Texas facility. Instruction provided in Louisiana is limited to nursing clinical experiences. Admission to the nursing program is selective

##### FACULTY AND STUDENTS

Two faculty, both fulltime, administer and teach at various facilities in the Shreveport area. One faculty member holds a master's degree while the other holds a baccalaureate. Faculty are recruited, screened, and employed through the central campus in Carthage. Panola reports a total enrollment of 928 students in the nursing programs

##### FACILITIES

The facilities in the Shreveport area include Willis Knighton Health Systems and Christus-Shumpert Medical Center. Access to library resources held at the institution's main campus is also provided for Louisiana residents.

##### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the admission standards of the program, the institution's regional and professional accreditation, and the oversight provided by the main campus, senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve license renewal for Panola College, located in Carthage, Texas.

## **Agenda Item III.A.2.d.**

### **South University Savannah, Georgia**

#### BACKGROUND

South University is not incorporated in the state of Louisiana. The university is a private university in the state of Georgia and was first licensed by the Board of Regents in 2011. The institution is headquartered in Savannah, Georgia, has campus operations in eight states and is authorized to offer distance education in fourteen states. South University is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools.

#### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

South University offers an online masters degree in nursing program to Louisiana residents. Typically, the online nature of the delivery system would not require licensure. However, since the program requires clinical experiences, licensure is necessary.

#### FACULTY

South University employs twenty-seven faculty to support its masters degree in nursing program available to Louisiana residents, all trained at the doctoral level. Of the twenty-seven faculty, nine are employed full-time.

#### FACILITIES

Since much of the proposed program will be offered online, there will be no need for physical facilities. Clinical experiences will be held in a variety of healthcare settings throughout Louisiana.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the college's campus and program accreditation, and the general oversight by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve license renewal for South University, headquartered in Savannah, Georgia.

## **Agenda Item III.A.2.e.**

### **Troy University Troy, Alabama**

#### **BACKGROUND**

Troy University is not incorporated in Louisiana. Although Troy was licensed in Louisiana from 1993 until it ceased operations at the Naval Support Activity Center in New Orleans in 2005, it reapplied and was licensed in 2011 to offer online degree programs to Louisiana residents. The institution is a publicly-supported university headquartered in Troy, Alabama and is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS).

#### **ACADEMIC PROGRAM**

Troy University is seeking to offer thirty of its online programs to Louisiana residents. The programs range from certificate through the doctoral level in areas such as business, criminal justice, education, public administration and sports training/administration. The business, sports training and education programs are accredited by the appropriate professional accrediting associations.

#### **FACULTY**

Troy University employs 201 faculty to support its online programs available to Louisiana residents, 100 on a full-time basis. One-hundred thirty-five of the faculty are trained at the doctoral level with the balance trained at the masters/specialist level.

#### **FACILITIES**

Since the proposed programs will be offered online, there will be no need for physical facilities. Field experiences and similar requirements will be held in a variety of settings depending on the subject nature of the program.

#### **STAFF RECOMMENDATION**

Given the credentials of its faculty, the college's campus and program accreditation, and the general oversight by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve license renewal for Troy University, headquartered in Troy, Alabama.

## **Agenda Item III.A.2.f.**

### **Western Governors University Salt Lake City, Utah**

#### BACKGROUND

Western Governors University (WGU) is not incorporated in the state of Louisiana. The university is a private university in the state of Utah and is seeking license renewal. Chartered uniquely as a competency-based institution by 19 western state governors in 1996, WGU is headquartered in Salt Lake City, Utah and operates in all fifty states. The institution is accredited by the Northwest Commission on Colleges and Universities.

#### ACADEMIC PROGRAM

Western Governors University offers a variety of online undergraduate (certificate and bachelors) and graduate (masters) programs to Louisiana residents. Typically, the online nature of the delivery system would not require licensure. However, since some of the programs require internships, field experiences or clinical experiences, licensure is necessary.

#### FACULTY

WGU employs 783 faculty to support its education programs, all on a full-time basis. Of the 783 faculty, 188 are trained at the doctoral level.

#### FACILITIES

Since all of the programs are offered online, there is no need for physical facilities. Clinical and field experiences are held in a variety of settings depending on the subject nature of the program.

#### STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Given the credentials of its faculty, the college's campus and program accreditation, and the general oversight by the home campus, the senior staff recommends that the Board of Regents approve license renewal for Western Governors University, headquartered in Salt Lake City, Utah.

The Louisiana Board of Regents' Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission met on Tuesday, July 9, 2013, at 10:10 a.m. in Room 1-190 of the Claiborne Building, Baton Rouge.

Chair Bender called the meeting to order and the roll was called.

Following a word of welcome from Chair Bender to new Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission member Melanie Amrhein, an appointee of the Louisiana Board of Regents, the first item of business was approval of the minutes from its meeting of March 12, 2013.

**On motion of Mr. Dorris, seconded by Mr. Lalonde, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission members unanimously adopted the minutes of the March 12, 2013 Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission meeting.**

The next agenda item considered by the Commission members was initial license applications, the first which were scheduled to be considered by the Commission at its May 14, 2013 meeting. Since a quorum was not established at the May meeting, the applications were included on the agenda for the July 9, 2013 meeting.

Ms. Marabella reviewed the application of D.D.C. School for Dental Assisting, LLC, for the Commission members informing them that the institution would be offering one program of study, Dental Assisting, which is a 75.0 clock hour program that will be offered for fifteen consecutive Saturdays. The program will be housed after hours in the practicing dental office of Dr. Dwight Landry, husband of the owner, Ms. Landry. D.D.C. School for Dental Assisting, LLC, had met all the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for an initial license.

Following further discussion,

**On motion of Mr. Dorris, seconded by Mr. D'Aquin, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve an initial operating license for D.D.C. School of Dental Assisting, LLC, located in Geismar, Louisiana.**

The second initial license application considered by the Commission members was from Divine Touch Healthcare Training, LLC, located in New Orleans, Louisiana. Ms. Marabella reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that the institution would be

offering one program of study, Certified Nursing Assistant, which is a four week, 80.0 clock hour program (inclusive of both classroom and clinical experience). The school will be housed in the Fellowship Hall of the Abundant Life Tabernacle Full Gospel Baptist Church. The program has received the required approval from the Department of Health and Hospitals, Health Standards Section. Divine Touch Healthcare Training, LLC, had met all the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for an initial license.

Following further discussion,

**On motion of Mr. Lalonde, seconded by Mr. Dorris, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve an initial operating license for Divine Touch Healthcare Training, LLC, located in New Orleans, Louisiana.**

The next initial license application to be considered by the Commission was from Lafayette General Medical Center School of Health Sciences, located in Lafayette, Louisiana, and represented by Ms. Tricia Broussard, Education Coordinator and Ms. Judy Robichaux, Director of Clinical Education. Ms. Kron reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that the institution would be offering one program of study, Certified Nursing Assistant, which is a three week, 80.0 clock hour program (inclusive of both classroom and clinical experience). The program has received the required approval from the Department of Health and Hospitals, Health Standards Section. Lafayette General Medical Center School of Health Sciences had met all the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for an initial license.

Following further discussion regarding the maximum number of students per class, employment opportunities for CNAs, an option for tuition reimbursement for qualified graduates who are hired by Lafayette General, and the average entry level salary of CNAs,

**On motion of Mr. D'Aquin, seconded by Mr. Fontenot, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve an initial operating license for Lafayette General Medical Center School of Health Sciences, located in Lafayette, Louisiana.**

The fourth initial license application to be considered by the Commission was from Life Care, LLC, located in Marrero, Louisiana, and represented by Ms. Irene Magee, Owner and School Director. Ms. Marabella reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that the institution would be offering one program of study, Certified Nursing Assistant, which is a three week, 80.0 clock hour program (inclusive of both classroom and clinical experience). The program has received the required approval from the Department of Health and Hospitals, Health Standards Section. Life Care, LLC, had met all the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for an initial license.

Following further discussion regarding the competition from area schools relative to program cost and the length of the program, the projected enrollment necessary to maintain financial solvency, and available financial resources to sustain the school, if necessary,

**On motion of Mr. D'Aquin, seconded by Mr. Fontenot, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve an initial operating license for Life Care, LLC, located in Marrero, Louisiana.**

The final initial license application to be considered by the Commission was from OnTrac Academy, located in Ponchatoula, Louisiana, and represented by Ms. Ashley Williams, Owner/Instructor. Ms. Kron reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that the institution would be offering one program of study, Pharmacy Technician, which is a six month, 915.0 clock hour program. The Pharmacy Technician program requires final approval from the Board of Pharmacy after Board of Regents licensure approval. OnTrac Academy, LLC had met all

the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for an initial license.

Following further discussion regarding how the name of the school was chosen, duties of a pharmacy technician, length of the program, payment plan options for students, competition from area schools relative to program cost, and projected enrollment necessary to maintain financial solvency, and available financial resources to sustain the school, if necessary,

**On motion of Mr. Fontenot, seconded by Mr. Dorris, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve an initial operating license for OnTrac Academy, LLC, located in Ponchatoula, Louisiana.**

The next agenda item considered by the Commission members involved a change-of-ownership license application from Louisiana Institute of Massage Therapy, located in Lake Charles, Louisiana, which was previously scheduled to be considered by the Commission at its May 14, 2013 meeting. Ms. Kron reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that Louisiana Institute of Massage Therapy has been licensed under the ownership of Susan and Michael Breaux since June 25, 1992. The institution will continue to offer the one program of study, Massage Therapy, which is a 510.0 clock hour program designed to be completed in seven months if enrolled in the weekday class and eleven months if enrolled in the weekend class. The change of ownership of the school will be seamless for the students in that the curriculum, instructors, and staff will remain the same. Louisiana Institute of Massage Therapy had met all the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for the change of ownership license.

Following further discussion,

**On motion of Mr. Dorris, seconded by Mr. D'Aquin, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve the change-of-ownership license application for Louisiana Institute of Massage Therapy, located in Lake Charles, Louisiana.**

The second change of ownership application considered by the Commission members involved New Horizons Computer Learning Center of New Orleans, located in Metairie, Louisiana, and represented by Mr. Robert Winker, Vice President of Sales. Ms. Kron reviewed the materials for the Commission members, informing them that New Horizons Computer Learning Center of New Orleans will continue to offer the programs approved prior to the change of ownership, various computer courses and Healthcare Information Management programs with concentrations in Medical Front Office Assistant, Physician and Hospital Billing & Coding, and Physician Billing. The change of ownership of the school will be seamless for the students in that the curriculum, instructors, and staff will remain the same. New Horizons Computer Learning Center of New Orleans had met all the legal and administrative requirements to be approved for the change of ownership license.

Following further discussion regarding the differences in ICD-9 and ICD-10 and implementation of the new codes,

**On motion of Mr. Fontenot, seconded by Mr. Lalonde, the Proprietary Schools Advisory Commission unanimously recommends that the Board of Regents approve the change-of-ownership license application for New Horizons Computer Learning Center of New Orleans, located in Metairie, Louisiana.**

The next agenda item considered by the Commission members was operating license renewals. Ms. Marabella informed the Commission members that there were twenty-five (25) schools seeking renewal that were previously scheduled for the May 14, 2013 meeting. These schools scheduled for renewal were in complete compliance, having met all the legal and administrative requirements to be re-licensed.
